

## **Spring Newsletter 4**

Welcome back to the second part of the spring term at WBJS. Below is a little update from each year group:

Year 3 are now studying the Bronze Age. This week we've learnt about 'grave goods'. The Stone Age Topic has really gripped the children who have brought in truck-loads of their own rocks to share. Mr Vane (real-life geologist and Dad) wowed everyone with stories of his travels and his collection of rocks and fossils. In music the children are learning new notes on their recorders and we were delighted by the positive start to our morning choir. Finally, we've started to learn a new sport called Boccia — it's an inclusive Paralympic sport.

Since half term, Year 4 have started to write their own Viking sagas based on the book 'The Saga of Erik the Viking' by Terry Jones. In maths we have been learning about perimeter of shapes and calculating perimeter. We've really enjoyed having a go at Curling in PE even though there's no ice in the hall and we're looking forward to starting Paceball again. Soon, we're hoping to make some vegetable samosas as part of our DT work.

It's been a busy couple of weeks for Year 5. To launch our new topic, the children enjoyed a variety of activities, including tasting some traditional Greek foods. Greek yoghurt and honey was a hit, but the olives were more controversial! A number of children have taken part in Bikeability and have learnt how to safely navigate the roads of West Bridgford. Feedback instructors has been positive and the children should feel proud of their achievements. Swimming has also started this week for half the year group, while the other half will be learning to play the glockenspiel as well as practise some tennis skills.

It is the turn of Year 6 to enjoy a dance unit with Joanna from Rattle and Roll Wednesday on mornings. We've been investigating Climate Change as part of our Frozen Planet topic, which ties in nicely with our DT unit, in which we're planning and making a wind turbine. As for Maths, this term is our first introduction to algebra! The Ice Bear is our current text in English, stimulating poetry last week and character development this week.

## **Rocksteady Concerts**

Later in March there will be an opportunity to hear what the children have been up to during their Rocksteady sessions. Each band will have an opportunity to perform the songs they have been working on and we are inviting parents of the children to come and watch the performances.
