

Spring Newsletter 5

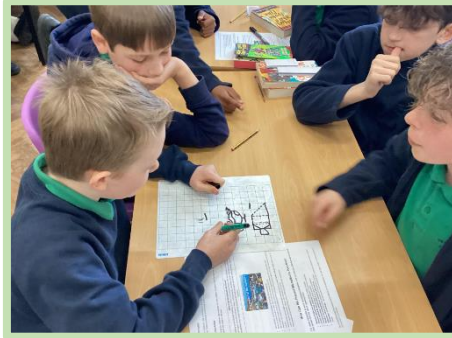
We are continuing to pack the weeks with so much exciting learning.

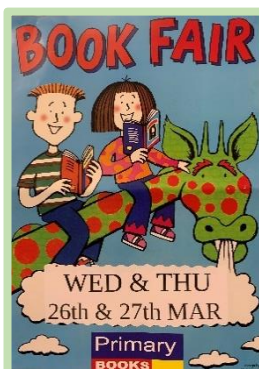


HSA
