Reception

The children had a great time at White Post Farm - they loved seeing all the animals. Because our children were 'Respectful Rangers' all day, they had a well-deserved ice lolly treat at school. Our lovely class butterflies have now grown and been released; the children enjoyed watching them fly away. They have learnt their number bonds to 10 and enjoyed maths day with the year 6 children from the junior school.

Year 1

The children have been creating sunflower Art inspired by Van Gogh. They had a fantastic trip to Wollaton Park and have spent time writing a lovely recount about their day. In science, they have continued their work about deciduous and evergreen leaves. The children participated in a session provided by a coach at Notts County Cricket Club. In Maths, the children have been learning about money.



Year 2

Year 2 also participated in a session provided by a coach at Notts County Cricket Club. They have been designing and constructing a chair for a toy that the children have brought in from home. They have been writing a letter of apology from the Big Bad Wolf to Little Red Riding Hood or her grandma. In maths, they have been working on addition and subtraction strategies - including exchanging. In science, the children have been learning about different food chains in plants and animals.

Year 3

Year 3 had a fabulous time at Magna Science Adventure Centre earlier this half term. We took part in two practical workshops where we learnt more about magnets and volcanoes. Not only were the workshops great fun and very informative, they also linked really well with our Science and Geography work this term as well as our work on rocks from last term! In between workshops, we had time to explore the different discovery zones of Earth, Water, Fire and Air. A particular highlight for many was the fire tornado! The time passed really quickly and before we knew it, it was time to get back on the coach and head back to Nottingham. We have enjoyed lots of other highlights this half term and been working hard in all our subjects. Our maths day all about money was a particular highlight!



Year 4

Year 4's half term has been typically busy. We began with two fabulous events: Ancient Egyptian Day where we had a wonderful visitor come to school and Samosa-making with Jat and Meena Hanspal - and that was in the first week alone! Since then, we've been investigating sound, discussing what we may find in our classroom (in French) and learning how to bowl without bending arms in P.E. In our English lessons we have been reading and writing stories based in Egypt. We have some wonderful authors in Year 4 and the teachers have loved reading our amazing stories!

Year 5

Year 5 have been immersing themselves in the geography of South America and the Amazon. They have produced some beautiful work to illustrate the rainforest layers and make comparisons to UK woodland. To accompany this, they have been reading 'The Explorer' by Katherine Rundell. It is a remarkable book full of wonderful characters, events and language, all of which the children are mining to make their own writing even better. Having settled on their ingredients for their bread, they will do the making after we return from the half term break.

Year 6

Year 6 have had been enjoying writing suspense stories based on the short film Alma. In Design and Technology, we have used problem-solving skills to build a working wind turbine capable of lifting a small object. For our topic 'The Golden Age of Islam' we have been using sources to compare what life was like in Baghdad in comparison to life in Anglo-Saxon Britain. We worked really hard in preparation for our SATs and did a great job during the week of tests – we also really enjoyed the pre-SATs breakfasts at school!
