One of our wonderful families organises the Musters Road Open Gardens and the event this year will take part on 21st June between 1-6pm. This great community event includes 10 or so gardens open to the public and will also include: a children's trail; craft activities at the Methodist & Baptist churches; live music; the Friary's allotments will be open; a plant stall and the Jesse Grey school garden will be also be open. Sit down teas & coffees as well as cakes & hot dogs will be available, & along the route you can buy ice creams & refreshments.

Adults pay £5 and under 16s are free. You pay at the first garden you visit (indicated by balloons) where you get a wristband & a map for the other locations. All proceeds go towards supporting the Friary, a charity on Musters Road that supports the homeless.
